

History of Diss

Here, avid Postcard collector and local historian Dennis Cross shares some of the historical postcards from his extensive collection...

Farming was the foundation of the area's wealth and helped build the prosperity of towns like Diss. Diss is mentioned in the Domesday Book as a moderately sized Royal Manor of no great importance. But when a market was established, it brought wealth to the town. Flemish weavers came from across the Channel and for many centuries wool and linen were the chief industries. These continued to flourish throughout the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries and many of the town's historic buildings from the era remain intact, for example the Dolphin Inn in the Market Place and Fair Green houses.

A focal point of the town through the years has been the Mere and in fact Diss gets its name from Dic or Disce which is Saxon for ditch of standing water. When a serious fire broke out in Mere Street in 1640, it was only the water from the lake, which covers five and a half acres, that saved the houses in the street. The greatest event of all came more than 250 years later in 1891, when the Mere completely froze over. The highlight was a carnival on ice when hundreds of skaters donned fancy dress to dance to the strains of a 30-strong band playing in the middle of the ice.

In this 2024/25 edition of the Diss Town Guide, I have displayed some postcards and photos of transport in the early 1900s and people at their work place in the Diss area. With the coming of the railways, farmers could get a better price for their produce in London. Building materials, coal, oil and household goods could be imported in and local factories could send their finished products to other parts of the country.

In the 1920s, lorries and vans started to appear making deliveries and collections with buses bringing villagers into Diss to shop.

Today we depend on various forms of transport - cars, lorries, vans etc. People commute by train to London in an hour and a half which was unheard of in the early 1900s when it took at least three hours.

HISTORY

Charabanc Trip, 1914

Ernest Froud with his charabanc about to set off for a trip to the coast with members of the Wesleyan Methodist Chapel. This was one of the first charabancs to be owned and operated in Diss. The top speed was about 15mph and the wooden-spoked wheels with sold tyres must have provided a very uncomfortable journey!



Early Post Van, c.1927

The first motorised vehicles used for postal deliveries in Diss were Model-T Fords, with wooden spoked wheels, no self-starter, hand-operated windscreen wipers and half doors which gave no protection against inclement weather. The only protective clothing issued was a peaked cap. Identified on the picture are Mr Copping of Roydon and Mr W. Nunn, a postman in Diss.



Diss Railway Station, 1905

The Eastern Union Railway came to Diss on 2nd July, 1849 - a service of four trains in each direction, weekdays only, from London to Burston. The route beyond Burston to Norwich came into operation five months later on 12th December, 1849. A journey time of five hours stopping at all stations. Most expresses started from Cromer around 1900 and didn't stop until they arrived at Ipswich.



Mr Frank Algar, Milkman, c.1925

Mr Frank Algar owned a dairy farm at Walcot Green. After early morning milking, he would commence his daily milk round.



Diss Station Goodsyard c.1962


Shire horses named Charlie and Mary are seen hauling a coal truck with porters Gerald Ravn-Johannesson and Barry Mobbs. These horses were soon to be retired with the introduction of diesels which, unlike steam locomotives, did not give off sparks and could easily shunt all sidings.



Mere Street, 1910.

Looking north along Mere St in 1910 right near where Chittys & West developed their garage on the left, you see different modes of transport including an early car, bicycle and a horse and cart. In the distance, on the right, is the Co-op's first bakery, later to become Currys selling bikes and radios.





Soda Water Works, c.1894

Gostling Soda Water Works was situated at the east end of Church Street adjoining what was then Finchams Meadows, later to become Uplands Way. Gostling & Co manufactured soda water priced at 2s 6d (12 1/2p) per dozen bottles, also lemonade, ginger beer, gingerade, seltzer water and various other drinks. All the water used in the manufacture of the drinks came from a deep well in Fincham Meadows. In the 1890s, horse-drawn wagons distributed to the local public houses and chemists.

What we do & how

Diss Town Council is the first tier of local government for Diss. First and foremost, we represent the community of Diss. We listen to residents and do our best to work with others to find solutions to issues in the town. We also put forward the views of the community to other organisations such as Norfolk County Council, South Norfolk Council, the Police, the local MP... the list goes on.

We also support local groups by providing community funding and promotion for as many as we can. We provide recreation spaces and amenities for the town, such as the markets, Mere & Park, sports facility, community centre and Cemetery, to name a few.

Of course, we can't always solve everything. But part of our job is to hold other organisations and authorities to account for services provided. We try to work in partnership with these organisations to find a better solution.

Our Vision is to make Diss a successful, vibrant, attractive town, where people want to live, work and visit.

Who does what?

The Town Council has up to 14 Town Councillors who voluntarily, democratically & lawfully make the strategic decisions. We also employ a small team of administrative and maintenance staff led by the Town Clerk who work together with councillors to ensure that the decisions of the Council are carried out.

The Council elects a Town Mayor at the Annual Town Meeting of Council each May. The Town Mayor chairs Full Council meetings and attends civic engagements and other functions as the Council's representative.

We also elect a Council Leader, who is responsible for leading the Council in the delivery of the Strategy Plan. S/he works closely with the Town Clerk on a day-to-day basis to help ensure the smooth running of the Council.

Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service (Diss)

Diss Fire Station is in the Southern district of Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service and has an establishment of 18 'On Call' personnel. Watch Manager Karl Hain is the officer in charge and is supported by three Crew Managers and 14 Firefighters. They all have primary employment elsewhere but are highly trained and carry a pager by which they are alerted, they report to the station within minutes once called. On average Diss attends 200 calls a year. Drill night (training and admin) takes place every Monday evening and at other times when required. on a training night.

Based at the station are two fire engines and a 'tactical response vehicle' (TRV). The two fire engines have similar capabilities and attend a wide range of incidents. Due to its off road capabilities the TRV is used predominantly for wildfires, but can also be called upon for support services during bad weather e.g. snow.

Also attached to the station are the Diss Fire Cadets aged from 13 to 18. They meet every

Tuesday for training and also take part in community activities. The cadet's leader is CM Rob Powell. If you are interested in joining the cadets, pop along on their training evening to find out more.

Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service is committed to making Norfolk safer and offers free 'Home Fire Risk Checks' to eligible persons whereby a member of the service will call to your home by appointment and offer fire safety advice. Diss Police Station

Inspector Andy Terry leads South Norfolk. His area consists of five teams of Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNTs) Patrol officers who will respond to your calls for service 24 hours a day, investigate the crimes in your area and work with the three Beat Managers (one for Diss- PC Andrew Baker, one for Long Stratton -PC Tom Hall & one for Harleston-PC Steve Phillips).

The team work in partnership with communities and other agencies to understand and address local problems.

The Diss SNT is responsible for Diss and the surrounding villages of Aslacton, Bunwell, Bressingham and Fersfield, Burston and Shimpling, Brockdish (inc. Thorpe Abbots),

Carleton Rode, Dickleburgh and Rushall, Gissing, Gt Moulton, Heywood, Needham, Roydon, Scole (inc.Thelveton and Billingford), Shelfanger, Tibenham, Tivetshall St Mary and St Margaret, Winfarthing.

Someone using violence or threatening violence

- · Where there is a danger to life
- Serious damage is being or could be caused to a property
- A potential criminal has been disturbed or apprehended
- A road traffic collision where someone is hurt and/or a danger is being caused to other road users.

In a non-emergency, you may use the external telephone at the police station which connects you through to the Control Room at Wymondham Headquarters.





Since its complete refurbishment and extension in 2017, the Corn Hall has provided a beautiful exciting, bright and welcoming community building that is completely accessible to everyone – locals and visitors alike – in the daytime as well as for evening events. It truly is a Hall for ALL!

Built in 1854 as an impressive and state-of-the-art structure at the heart of historic Diss, the Corn Hall was originally built for trading corn and other goods and has a fascinating history, much of which is explained throughout the building. Since 2010 it has been run by The Diss Corn Hall Trust as a lively arts venue and is once again taking centre stage in the community life of the town.

The Corn Hall's exciting and wide-ranging events programme attracts audiences from a wide area. Regular events include performances by high profile personalities, comedians and bands, a variety of touring and local theatre, family events and activities, film screenings, live satellite broadcasts of West End shows and contemporary art exhibitions.

The Corn Hall also hosts many community groups, classes, activities and opportunities including: Chatty Wednesdays, Arts Award, life drawing classes, Diss Fine Arts Society, Saturday clubs, school holiday activities, Greasepaint Academy, Time with Friends - Dementia Cafe, Diss Museum on Tour, education/work experience opportunities and volunteering.

Refreshment facilities: The café is open Monday-Saturday, 9.30am-3pm serving great coffee and speciality teas, as well as light food and homemade cakes. Both the bar and café are open from 6.30pm before main evening events or an hour before earlier ones.

The venue is fully wheelchair accessible.

Quaker Wood

Quaker Wood is now in its second decade. It lies on Factory Lane between Diss and Roydon. It is owned and managed by Diss Community Woodland Project, a local voluntary group and is open all year round. It has been planted with a mixture of indigenous hardwood species. It also benefits from some fine mature hedgerow oak trees, a central pond and a grassland area that is managed for wildflowers.

The management objectives are to develop and maintain the area as woodland and open space, for the benefit of both the local people and the local wildlife. Local schools, youth and adult organisations have all made use of Quaker Wood for outdoor learning or quiet recreation. Structured activities for different age groups and interests are provided by the management committee. Working parties are held on the first Saturday morning and third Wednesday morning of each month to carry out a variety of management tasks according to the season. These include brush cutting, tree care, pruning, scything, hedgelaying etc and it will not be long before thinning and production of woodland material will be part of the management. All ages are most welcome at the working parties and no special skills are required. If you would just like to chat and find out a little bit more, then turn up mid morning on any first Saturday of the month. Running

costs are covered entirely by local voluntary donations. Significant financial contributions, especially those that celebrate family occasions, are acknowledged by a suitably engraved plaque at the entrance. Diss Museum is situated in the Market Place in a building called The Shambles, formerly two butchers' shops. There are a variety of displays, frequently changed, about the history of the town and area. Always on display are the Old Rectory Doll's House and old photos and jottings from the Memory Bank. Local firms like Cupiss, Aldrich, Anness and Gaze have all been featured. Panels in the windows depict significant characters and events from the town's past. Outreach activities include: talks to groups and schools, tours of the town (including a Murder Tour) and involvement in events like the Roydon Riots Centenary (1993), Skelton Festival (2004), Nelson Bicentenary (2005), Betjeman Centenary (2006), Local History Festival (2007), Tom Paine Festival (2009),

Friends In High Places: The Manning Story (2011), The Friendly Invasion (2012) and the R34 Adventure (2019). In 2014 the museum was behind the project to put the missing names on the war memorial. The museum is administered by a registered Charitable Trust. In 2019 Accreditation was awarded by the Arts Council. Accreditation is the UK standard for museums and galleries. It defines good practice and identifies agreed standards, thereby encouraging development, helping to guide museums to be the best they can be. The museum has won a Gulbenkian Award for the greatest improvements achieved with limited resources. The Tom Paine Festival won the East of England Market Towns Culture Award and a Museums & Heritage Award for Excellence for the best project on a limited budget. The day-to-day running of the museum is largely by volunteers. The Friends of Diss Museum provide stewards and financial support for special projects. The museum is open from 11am-3pm every day except Sunday from mid-March to the end of October, Admission is free.

Please look at the pictures on the left of this text. They illustrate two aspects of what church is: When hearing the word 'church', people may primarily think of buildings such as the portrayed St Mary's church built around 1300 but said to stand on the site of a late Saxon or Norman church. Additional church buildings were added in Diss over the years, their architecture reflecting varied church traditions and preferred styles of worship.

The essence of what church is, however, is reflected in the people who meet to worship God, to enjoy fellowship and serve the needs of others. Activities range from pre-school playgroups and scout groups to opportunities for adults to meet for fellowship and to explore the Christian faith. All churches welcome newcomers, including those who may just be at the start of their spiritual journey. Practical and prayer support is offered to those experiencing times of illness, bereavement and personal crisis. Because of the variety of traditions and orientations within the churches in Diss, there is a community suited to everyone's interests and needs.

The second picture on the left bears witness to the desire of the church leaders, both ordained ministers and lay preachers, to meet

throughout the year, underlining their churches' common spiritual roots. Regular Diss and District Christian Churches Together meetings enable the sharing of information and the planning of common events. On Good Friday local Christians meet at the Mere's Mouth and, following a short meditation silently walk to St Mary's Parish Church for an ecumenical service. During Lent, lunches are held in several local churches, enabling members to meet informally and to financially support the work of Christian Aid. Diss and District Christian Churches Together also support the Waveney Foodbank.




