Council news



New councillor joins DTC

A huge welcome to Catherine Dente, who was co-opted to Diss Town Council at the March Full Council meeting. Catherine has over two decades of experience in the property sector and has recently set up an estate agency business with her husband in the town centre. She has lived close to Diss for most of her life and is actively involved in the local community.

Their business supports local charities, Diss High School's breakfast club & free fruit initiative and The Shelf at Citizens Advice. She decided to apply to be a Town Councillor as she thinks Diss is a wonderful town, is keen to take a role in its future and now has the time to give back to her community.

DYCC

Councillors received a presentation from FMG Consulting Ltd regarding their findings from the recent survey and stakeholder engagement on the Diss Youth & Community Centre in March. Thank you to the 331 residents who completed the survey. Onethird live outside Diss so although this represents just over 2% of the population, which is too low to be statistically significant, the survey was intended to gauge initial public opinion and not provide any immediate answers.

There was broadly a lot of support for further exploring a new roof or building on the same site with access being the primary concern for the Sports Ground site. A key issue is affordability as very few are prepared to pay substantially more Council Tax to contribute to the considerable costs of any option and there is sensitivity to hire charges.

Critical to next steps are South Norfolk District Council's decisions around the John Grose site development to avoid duplication. Monthly meetings are scheduled with the relevant District Officer to maximise engagement and maintain strong relations. Further work will include liaising with the District Council on capital planning and spending thresholds, assessing demand, developing a business case including options appraisal and financial analysis, and seeking external grants given the considerable investment required.

Diss Town Council will continue to engage with residents as the project progresses and encourages the public to respond to any future consultations to help guide decisionmaking and ensure we get the best outcomes for Diss taxpayers.

Improving biodiversity

We've stripped out the weeds, laid matting and introduced new greenery along the Lowes leading to the river Waveney to improve biodiversity and create a more vibrant, natural environment for everyone to enjoy. The old hedge at Rectory Meadow has been removed and a new green fence with two gates has been installed with a new planting scheme scheduled for the Autumn. Four new native trees will be planted to create seasonal interest and a source of pollen and berries for wildlife, interspersed with new easy-to-manage 2-metre length hedges to achieve the highest net biodiversity gain.

At the Assets, Infrastructure & Events meeting in July, members will consider a lowcost proposal to improve the appearance and biodiversity of the Park through a winter and spring flowering bulb display along Park Road in between the established trees. These projects are all in support of our recently adopted Biodiversity policy and to improve the green corridor network around the town. Thank you to George Waterman for his help in delivering these projects for Diss.

Discover Creativity at Designermakers21: A Hub for Art, Craft, and Community in Diss

Designermakers21, home of DesignermakersCIO, is perched at the top of the Heritage Triangle in Diss, opposite the Corn Hall. A vibrant collective of artist's studios across two floors, there is always something new to discover.

Open to the public every Thursday to Saturday, visitors can chat to resident makers in their studios to find out about their diverse processes, which include weaving, mosaic, printmaking, ceramics, metalwork, textiles, and mixed media. The ground floor galleries display a fantastic variety of high-quality Art & Craft for sale, while the upstairs gallery has a rolling programme of events including exhibitions, workshops, and temporary studios.

It has been a busy couple of years for designermakers21, and our Charity DesignermakersCIO, with successful fundraising campaigns to secure the purchase of 21 St Nicholas Street in early 2024, and complete essential building improvements. We were overwhelmed by the support received, both from major grant donors and the local and wider community.

Now, onto the future! While fundraising continues for building developments to improve accessibility for all, 2025 is already shaping up to be a year full of fantastic events. We have two Craft Fairs lined up, an exhibition by Diss High School students and two shows by local artists. Our Summer Expo and winter Saori Weaving exhibitions will return once again. New for this year is an exciting Workshop Programme with opportunities to get creative and learn something new. Keep an eye out for our ever-popular 'Have a Go' days, full of activities to try with our members.

Quaker Wood – A place for Nature, and for People

Quaker Wood continues to develop and grow, with it now nearly 15 years since the first saplings were planted. Many of those first saplings are now part of a tall and dense canopy, a mixture of birch and oak, ash and hazel, among many other species. The impressive growth of these trees has created the need for a new project for our volunteers to undertake.

Starting at our February work party, our volunteers have been thinning the canopy of the woodland near the site entrance. This is being done to allow light to reach the woodland floor, in order to give shrubs and undergrowth a chance to establish and spread, creating valuable habitat for a wide variety of birds, mammals and insects.

The team are also working to enhance our wildflower meadow, located at the centre of the wood. In winter we cut a strip of the meadow as low as our mower would allow, then rotavated the strip to turn the soil. We are observing the strip this season to see if our work has unearthed any dormant wildflower seeds or encouraged some new species to appear. If we are successful, then next year we'll repeat the process in another strip!

We always welcome new volunteers to join our work parties, which meet at the wood on the first Saturday of every month, from 9:30am for a few hours. We are also keen to encourage people who may be interested in joining our Steering Group, to help us find ways to manage and improve Quaker Wood, and ensure that it remains what it was intended to be all those years ago, a place for nature and for people.

Diss & District Royal British Legion Honoured with Prestigious Award



The Diss and District Royal British Legion (RBL) Branch has been recognised for its outstanding progress and efficiency, receiving the esteemed Addison-Williamson Award at the Royal British Legion Norfolk County Conference, held at Norfolk County Hall on 1st February 2025.

This award acknowledges the Branch's dedicated efforts in strengthening community ties and promoting remembrance. Key to their success has been collaboration with Diss Town Council, use of multimedia platforms - including a dedicated website, Facebook page, and community forums - as well as regular engagement with local newspapers and radio stations.

A highlight of their activities in 2024 was the Diss Remembrance Drumhead Service, held in partnership with the Diss Salvation Army. This moving event blended tradition with accessibility, ensuring the public could fully participate. Young members from local schools and cadet forces played a poignant role, reading aloud the names from the Diss War Memorial, before the Remembrance Service at St Mary's Church. The Branch also played a vital role in town events, supporting the Diss Carnival and leading the town's Armed Forces Day celebrations - the latter in partnership with the Royal Air Forces Association (RAFA) and local Army and Air Cadets.

Representing the Branch at the awards ceremony were Mary Cotton (joint Diss Citizen of the Year 2024) and Robert J Rogers, Branch Secretary, who proudly accepted the framed certificate, signed by the County Chairman and County President, on behalf of the entire team.

Adding to this achievement, the Branch will be featured in a full-page spread in the next edition of the Royal British Legion magazine, reaching over 200,000 members worldwide.

This well-earned recognition highlights the dedication and commitment of the Diss and District RBL, ensuring the legacy of remembrance remains strong within the community.



10 years of Dementia Support at Diss United Reformed Church



Diss United Reformed Church runs several community groups, but this year marks the 10th anniversary of our popular Dove Dementia Cafe. We first opened our Dove Dementia doors in January 2015 to just one person with dementia. But over the years we have grown in size and now regularly seat between 50 and 60 people for lunch. We celebrated our 10th anniversary at our February Dove Dementia Cafe and a good time was had by all!

Our cafe is held on the first Wednesday of every month from 10am-1pm, it's specifically for people living with dementia and their carers and it is free of charge. Our first hour is always spent together with hot drinks and cake. At this time, games such as dominoes are available, as are jigsaw puzzles and a quiz, but this is also a time for catching up with friends. During the second hour, there is a support group for the carers in a separate room should they wish to go to it. Everyone else takes part in an activity, with our members with dementia being supported by our wonderful volunteers. We have different activities each month which vary from art, poetry, music and exercise, to having outside entertainers visiting. Then we all come back together for the final hour for a light lunch.

If you have, or are caring for someone with dementia, and would like to join us please come along; we would love to welcome you. You may also like to join us for Dove Song from 1.30pm-3pm on the third Monday of each month. This is a free music therapy session for people with dementia.



Blacker Bombard



If German tanks had approached Diss past Roydon School in WW2, they would have had a nasty shock.

The Home Guard had a formidable weapon called the Blacker Bombard to protect the town in the event of invasion.

The site has recently been identified and will be commemorated by an event on VE Day, with a plaque and the naming of a new street as Bombard Way.

Stewart Blacker was a career soldier who served in India, flew in WW1 (surviving five crashes), fought in the trenches and again in India.

He devised a machine gun that would shoot through the propeller of an aircraft. He was too old to fight in WW2 but invented various mortars - the Bombard, the Hedgehog, the Petard and the Piat.

He realised that the infantryman needed a hand-held weapon against tanks; but had his own battles in trying to convince Whitehall of this need.

In 1939, he said, the army had the best swords and lances but seemed to be prepared for the war before last, with a dire lack of modern weapons. Luckily, Churchill was on his side and managed to provide the Home Guard with 22,000 Bombards. They were never used because the Germans never came. There will be a presentation at 7pm in Denmark Lane on Thursday 8 May, with reenactors, WW2 songs and a model Bombard. People are encouraged to come in 1940s costumes, with prizes for the best, before moving to the Park for the beacon ceremony (see p36 for VE event details). The event is supported by Diss Museum, local re-enactors, Diss Community Woodland Project and Places for People.





On Thursday 8th May 2025, as the nation comes together to remember the millions who paid the ultimate sacrifice to secure the freedom we all enjoy today, Diss will mark the 80th anniversary of VE Day with two special events.

A parade of cadets and scouts around the Park will signal the start of the beacon lighting event at 8.30pm. Awaiting their arrival will be representatives of the Diss & District Royal British Legion branch, Royal Air Force Association, Salvation Army, Churches Together and special guests including the Deputy Lieutenant for Norfolk and King's representative. The VE-Day commemoration will include the Epitaph, a moving performance of the Last Post followed by a two-minute silence paying tribute to those who gave their lives during the war.

A poem will be read by Diss High School students before the reveille, raising of the standards and prayers. The beacon will then be lit to signify the light that emerged from the darkness of war, whilst we all join in singing two hymns, 'I vow to thee my country' and 'Land of Hope & Glory' lead by Birgitta Kenyon and Ella-Rose O'Grady (Voice Squad), accompanied by our local Salvation Army brass band. The event will conclude with a special Tribute, Proclamation, and the National Anthem.

Shortly before this event at 7pm, you can see the unveiling of the Blacker Bombard. Find out more on p35.

Other events taking place in 2025 to celebrate the 80th anniversary of the end of WWII in Europe include Armed Forces Day on Saturday 28th June (see more opposite), VJ Day 80 on 15th August, and as part of the Friendly Invasion Festival events programme, delivered by South Norfolk & Broadland Council across the District, an event in Diss on 6th September to honour more than 300,000 Americans who settled into airbases scattered across East Anglia.

Armed Forces Day

Armed Forces Day will take place in Diss Town centre on Sat 28 June 2025, between 10am and 3pm.

In the 80th anniversary year of VE Day (Victory in Europe) and VJ Day (Victory in Japan), and our own Royal British Legion Branch Centenary we would like to make this an event to remember for serving personnel, veterans and the Diss and District community. This event is not intended to glorify war but to acknowledge the contributions that our grandparents and great grandparents made to provide us with a legacy of freedom.

The event celebrates the contribution made by service personnel, veterans, uniformed youth organisations, families and everyone involved in serving our community.





Diss Town Council Supports Local Organisations

Diss Town Council is committed to assisting voluntary and not-for-profit organisations working for the benefit of Diss residents. One of the ways this is done is through financial grants.

In the 2024-25 financial year, the full £10k grant pot was awarded to four local organisations. MTM Youth Services was awarded £2,500 to continue delivering projects to reach more young people and support those with more complex needs. Dove Song Plus was awarded £600 to support a singing group for adults with complex needs and their carers. The Diss Corn Hall Trust received £590 towards hosting a monthly Open Mic Night and My Period Ltd was awarded £1k towards providing free accessible period products and advance education. Park Radio Ltd is the recipient of £5,310 to deliver the Voices of Diss - A Community Storytelling & Oral History Project.

At the Annual Town Meeting on 30th April, residents will hear how this fund helped Diss Town Football Club with their new floodlighting project. Steve Flatman, Chairman of DTFC said, "With the support of Diss Town Council and various other donations and grants, the Club was able to update its main pitch floodlights, which will benefit the Club and community for many years to come. As well as less light pollution, improved illumination of the playing surface and lower running costs due to a more energy-efficient LED system, our carbon footprint is greatly reduced." The new grant fund for 2025-26 of £10k is now open. We're particularly interested in applications that support our town's distinction and heritage, partnership and synergy, and community and people. Applications received by 31st May will be considered in July for payment from September onwards.

We can also provide volunteering experience for young people completing their Duke of Edinburgh Award, having already helped several young residents gain the hours they need in order to pass the Award!

Safer Neighbourhood Team

The safer neighbourhood team are currently concentrating on road safety, after public consultation in January. Over the past few months, the SNT have been conducting speed enforcement and traffic operations, as well as visiting schools and youth groups to give road safety presentations. We have also been working with partner agencies to address road safety concerns.

The team has spent time promoting a number of useful schemes including the Herbert protocol and Neighbourhood watch.

The Herbert protocol scheme helps support vulnerable people, aiding their independence and protecting them if they get lost or go missing. A form can be filled out containing their details such as contact numbers, medication needs, locations the vulnerable person likes to visit and an up-todate photo. This form can then be sent or handed to the police if that person goes missing - it is used to save time when trying to locate them.

Neighbourhood Watch is about people getting together with their neighbours to take action to reduce crime. It works by developing a close relationship between community members and the local police. Neighbourhood Watch schemes can:

- cut crime and the opportunities for crime
- help to reassure those who live in the area
- encourage neighbourliness and closer communities
