History of Diss

Here, avid Postcard collector and local historian Dennis Cross shares some of the historical postcards from his extensive collection ...

Farming was the foundation of the area's wealth and helped build the prosperity of towns like Diss. Diss is mentioned in the Domesday Book as a moderately sized Royal Manor of no great importance. But when a market was established, it brought wealth to the town. Flemish weavers came from across the Channel and for many centuries wool and linen were the chief industries. These continued to flourish throughout the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries and many of the town's historic buildings from the era remain intact, for example the Dolphin Inn in the Market Place and Fair Green houses.

A focal point of the town through the years has been the Mere and in fact Diss gets its name from Dic or Disce which is Saxon for ditch of standing water. When a serious fire broke out in Mere Street in 1640, it was only the water from the lake, which covers five and a half acres, that saved the houses in the street. The greatest event of all came more than 250 years later in 1891, when the Mere completely froze over. The highlight was a carnival on ice when hundreds of skaters donned fancy dress to dance to the strains of a 30-strong band playing in the middle of the ice.

Many of the shops in Diss, especially those in St Nicholas Street, date back hundreds of years and have picturesque overhanging upper storeys. Friday is Market Day. Shops and pubs were open until 10pm, mainly because farm workers weren't paid until late Friday and Saturday. Tuesday was half-day closing.

At the time these postcard views were taken, you would not have had to shop outside the Diss area. Now, supermarkets and the internet have taken over.

Market Place c 1912

The Parish Church of St Mary's dominates the town and the Market Place, being a fine example of 13th century ecclesiastical architecture. In 1135, King Stephen granted the townspeople of Diss the right to hold a weekly market on Friday and a fish market on Tuesday evenings.

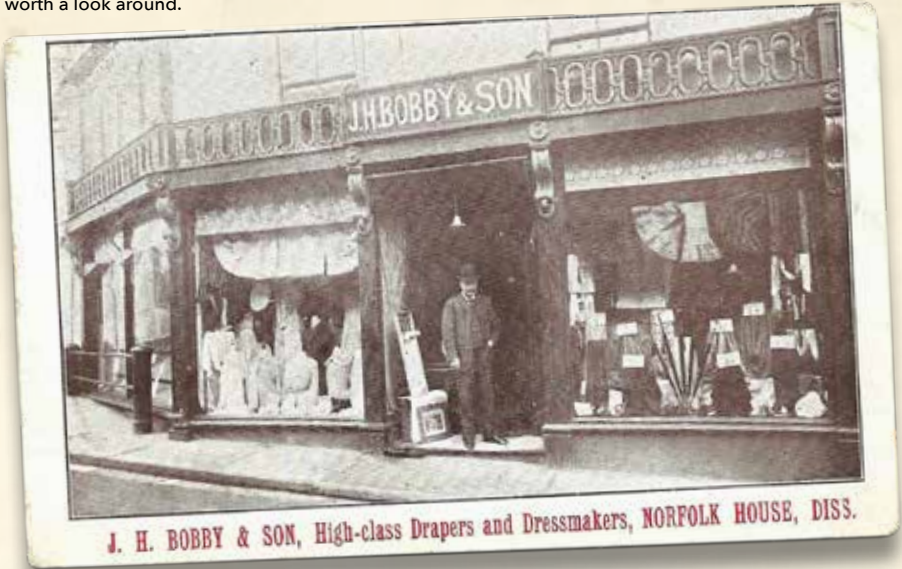


Alexandra Rose Day, 1914

St Nicholas Street, looking west from St Mary's Church. The street is decorated for Alexandra Rose Day, which still exists and was founded in honour of Queen Alexandra, with the proceeds going to children's charities. It was held originally on Queen Victoria's birthday in May. The butcher's shop, with meat hanging in front of the window, belonged to a Walter Anness. This shop is still in existence as a butcher's shop today and is run by the Browne family.

J.H. Bobby & Son, 1920

Norfolk House was situated in St Nicholas Street. J.H. Bobby & Son were high-class drapers and dressmakers who also sold carpets such as Wiltons and Axminsters, unique designs in inlaid linoleums, floor cloths, mats, mattings and rugs to match carpets. Today, the Norfolk House shop is a gift shop that's well worth a look around.



John Aldrich, Market Hill, c 1903

John Aldrich's shop, established in 1832, was situated just off the Market Place. This postcard view shows the shop decorated to celebrate the Coronation of Edward VII in 1903. A disastrous fire on 17th June 1938, resulted in the shop being gutted even though it was attended by five fire engines and plenty of water from the Mere at the rear of the property. Larter & Ford now occupy this site.

Aldrich & Bryant, c 1910

The Aldrich & Bryant shop was situated opposite St Mary's Church and was your grocer, selling everyday needs. By the 1920s this shop had made way for the new Midland Bank, with the first manager being Mr E.E. Greenaway. Today HSBC UK Bank is serving all money needs on this site.



Mount Street, 1912

Mount Street was formerly called Mound or Smith Street. This postcard view, looking North from the Church, shows the Post Office which was open and built in 1849 and served the town until a far bigger Post Office was built overlooking the Market Place in May 1953.



Denmark Street c 1909

In 1909, the Royal Norfolk Show was held in Diss at Walcott Hall. Shops were decorated for this occasion as shown in this picture. On the right, was Fred Studd's hairdressers, now an office. Further along was Shorts the Tailors, also now an office. The next building has been completely demolished and a road passes over this site today leading to a group of flats.

Garnhams Shoe Shop, 1905

This shop was situated at the top of Market Hill where the road joins St Nicholas Street. The building is now occupied by a Chinese restaurant and takeaway. In the Middle Ages, the site was originally St Nicholas Chapel. According to records, there used to be a tunnel running from the Greyhound Public House to the chapel and a graveyard existed where Gaze's offices now stand on Market Hill.

What we do & how

Diss Town Council is the first tier of local government for Diss. First and foremost, we represent the community of Diss. We listen to residents and do our best to work with others to find solutions to issues in the town. We also put forward the views of the community to other organisations such as Norfolk County Council, South Norfolk Council, the Police, the local MP... the list goes on.

We also support local groups by providing community funding and promotion for as many as we can. We provide recreation spaces and amenities for the town, such as the markets, Mere & Park, sports facility, community centre and cemetery, to name a few.

Of course, we can't always solve everything. But part of our job is to hold other organisations and authorities to account for services provided. We try to work in partnership with these organisations to find a better solution.

Our vision is to make Diss a successful, vibrant, attractive town, where people want to live, work and visit.

Who does what?

The Town Council has up to 14 Town Councillors who voluntarily, democratically & lawfully make the strategic decisions. We also employ a small team of administrative and maintenance staff led by the Town Clerk who work together with councillors to ensure that the decisions of the Council are carried out. The Council elects a Town Mayor at the Annual

Town Meeting of Council each May. The Town Mayor chairs Full Council meetings and attends civic engagements and other functions as the Council's representative.

We also elect a Council Leader, who is responsible for leading the Council in the delivery of the Strategy Plan. S/he works closely with the Town Clerk on a day-to-day basis to help ensure the smooth running of the Council.

In an emergency where you need police, ambulance or fire service assistance urgently, call **999**.

Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service (Diss)

Diss Fire Station is in the Southern district of Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service and has an establishment of 18 Firefighters made up of Watch Manager Robert Powell, four Crew Managers and 13 Firefighters. They all have primary employment elsewhere but are highly trained and carry a pager by which they are alerted, they report to the station within minutes once called. Last year, Diss attended 340 calls. Drill night (training and admin) takes place every Monday evening and at other times when required. If you are interested in joining the 'On Call' visit the website:

Based at the station are two fire engines and a 'tactical response vehicle' (TRV). The two fire engines have similar capabilities and attend a wide range of incidents. Due to its off road capabilities the TRV is used predominantly for wildfires, but can also be called upon for support services during bad weather e.g. snow.

Also attached to the station are the Diss Fire Cadets aged from 13 to 18. They meet every Tuesday for training and also take part in community activities. The cadet's leaders are

CM Rob Powell and FF Stuart Williamson. If you are interested in joining the cadets, pop along on their training evening to find out more.

Norfolk Fire and Rescue Service is committed to making Norfolk safer and offers free 'Home Fire Risk Checks' to eligible persons whereby a member of the service will call to your home by appointment and offer fire safety advice. Diss Police Station

Inspector Chris Tomkins leads South Norfolk. His area consists of eight teams of Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNTs) Patrol officers who will respond to your calls for service 24 hours a day, investigate the crimes in your area and work with the three Beat Managers (one for Diss - PC Andrew Baker, one for Long Stratton - PC Tom Hall & one for Harleston - Acting Sergeant Steve Phillips).

The team work in partnership with communities and other agencies to understand and address local problems.

The Diss SNT is responsible for Diss and the surrounding villages of Aslacton, Bunwell, Bressingham and Fersfield, Burston and Shimpling, Brockdish (inc. Thorpe Abbots), Carleton Rode, Dickleburgh and Rushall, Gissing, Gt Moulton, Heywood, Needham,

Roydon, Scole (inc. Thelveton and Billingford), Shelfanger, Tibenham, Tivetshall St Mary and St Margaret, Winfarthing.

In an emergency always call 999. Dialling 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately. Such emergencies may include:

- Someone using violence or threatening violence

- Where there is a danger to life
- Serious damage is being or could be caused to a property
- A potential criminal has been disturbed or apprehended
- A road traffic collision where someone is hurt and/or a danger is being caused to other road users.

In a non-emergency, you may use the external telephone at the police station which connects you through to the Control Room at Wymondham Headquarters.

Built in 1854 as an impressive, state-of-the-art corn exchange, The Corn Hall has a rich and fascinating history, much of which can still be discovered throughout the building today. Since 2010, it has been managed by The Diss Corn Hall Trust and has once again taken centre stage in the cultural and community life of Diss.

The Corn Hall's diverse and exciting events programme attracts audiences from across the region. Regular events include performances by high-profile personalities, comedians and bands, touring and local theatre, family shows and activities, film screenings, live satellite broadcasts from the West End, and contemporary art exhibitions.

In addition to its events programme, The Corn Hall Diss is home to a wide range of community groups, classes and activities, from yoga and sound baths to creative workshops. It is a welcoming place where people can come together to learn, grow and feel connected. Weekly meet-ups are held for parents and carers with babies and pre-school children, as well as for adults looking to make friends and build confidence in a friendly environment. 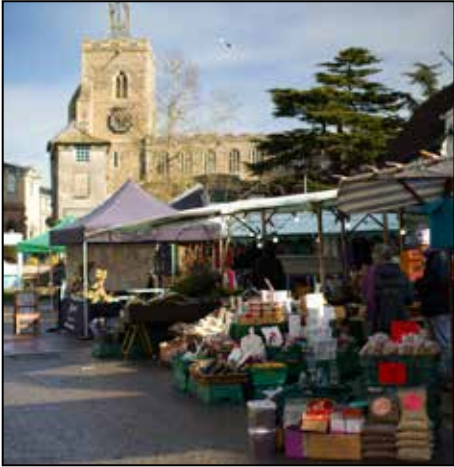

Diss Museum

Diss Museum is situated in the Market Place in a building called The Shambles, formerly two butchers' shops. There are a variety of displays, frequently changed, about the history of the town and area. Always on display are the Old Rectory Doll's House and old photos and jottings from the Memory Bank. Local firms like Cupiss, Aldrich, Anness and Gaze have all been featured. Panels in the windows depict significant characters and events from the town's past. Outreach activities include: talks to groups and schools, tours of the town

(including a Ghost Walk) and involvement in events like the Roydon Riots Centenary (1993), Skelton Festival (2004), Nelson Bicentenary (2005), Betjeman Centenary (2006), Local History Festival (2007), Tom Paine Festival (2009), Friends In High Places: The Manning Story (2011), The Friendly Invasion (2012) and the R34 Adventure (2019). In 2014 the museum was behind the project to put the missing names on the war memorial. The museum is administered by a registered Charitable Trust. In 2019 Accreditation was awarded by the Arts Council. Accreditation is the UK standard for museums and galleries. It defines good practice and identifies agreed standards, thereby encouraging development, helping to guide museums to be the best they can be. The museum has won a Gulbenkian Award for the greatest improvements achieved with limited resources. The Tom Paine Festival won the East of England Market Towns Culture Award and a Museums & Heritage Award for Excellence

Diss High School, on Walcot Road, is the town's co-educational secondary school and sixth form, serving students from Year 7 to Year 13 within the Enrich Education Trust. It offers a broad, ambitious curriculum with strong academic pathways through GCSE and into a large sixth form, including A Levels and Level 3 vocational courses, alongside protected provision for the arts, modern languages and practical subjects. In 2025, attainment outcomes at both Key Stage 4 and Key Stage 5 were above the averages for Norfolk and for England, reflecting the school's strong academic culture and high expectations. Diss High School is currently judged by Ofsted to be a 'Good' school following its full inspection in March 2024. The inspection report notes, for example, that "the curriculum is well designed, ambitious and meets pupils' needs" and that pupils benefit from a wide range of clubs and activities that enrich their experiences.

In March 2025, The Sunday Times identified Diss High School as the 5th happiest secondary school in England and the happiest in Norfolk, using five years of Ofsted Parent View data, with over 99% of parents saying their child is happy at the school—well above national

In Roman times there was a local Christian community revealed by archaeological discoveries in the 1980's which revealed burials in a Christian manner. A Roman style memorial was placed over some excavated Roman remains re-interred in Scole Churchyard. The local Christian witness has continued through Saxon, Norman, Medieval times, through to the present day. The active Christian churches of the town, some large with choirs, organs and bands, and some small and contemplative, all meet to worship God in their own tradition and style. These churches support full time ministers and lay workers and many have links with, and support churches in, faraway parts of the world.

However grand, modern or impressive church buildings are, the real Christian church in Diss is the people who meet together, to worship God and serve the needs of others. The varied activities are shown in each church section and activities range from pre-school playgroups, to groups for the retired, as well as fellowship and exploring the Christian faith. All the local churches welcome newcomers, including those who may just be on the start of their own spiritual journey.

Many inter-church friendships have been formed through Diss and Roydon Churches Together. On Good Friday local Christians meet at the Mere's Mouth and following a short service, silently walk to St Mary's Parish

Church for an ecumenical service. Christian Aid lunches are held around local churches during Lent and enable local people to meet informally and support such a worthwhile cause.

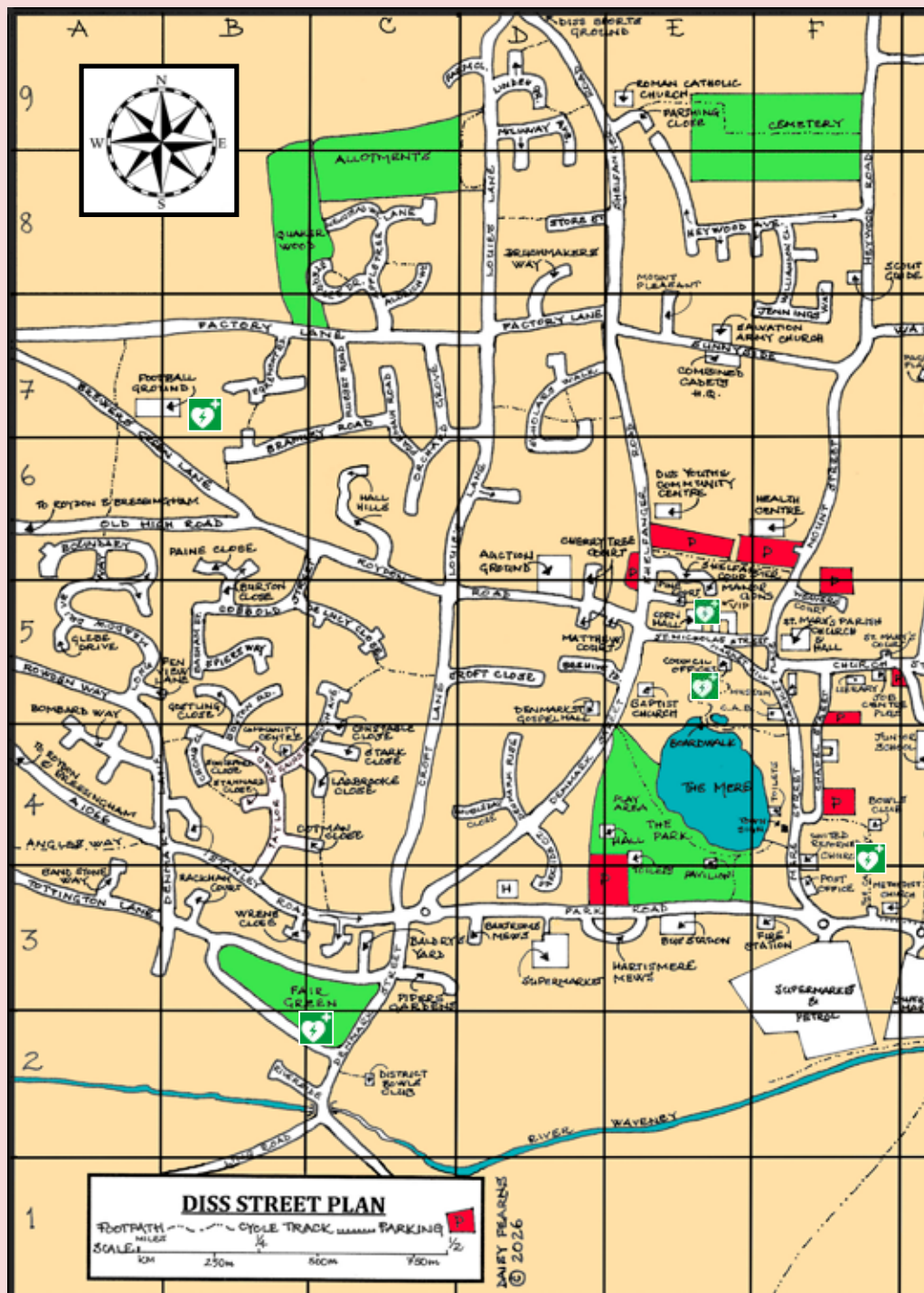

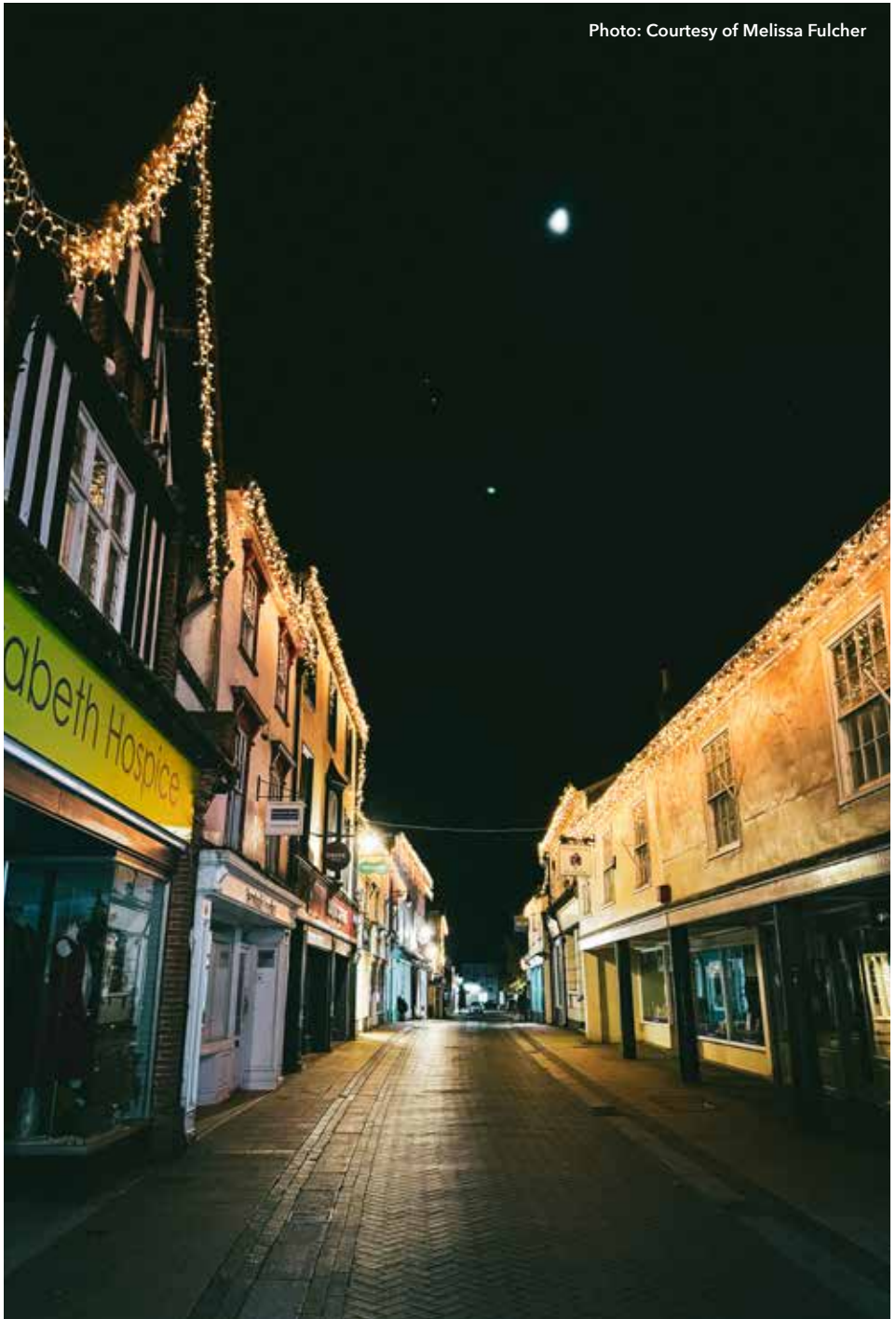
